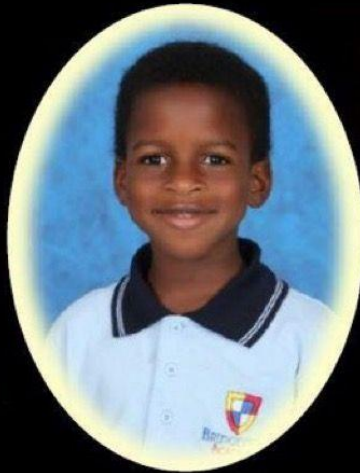

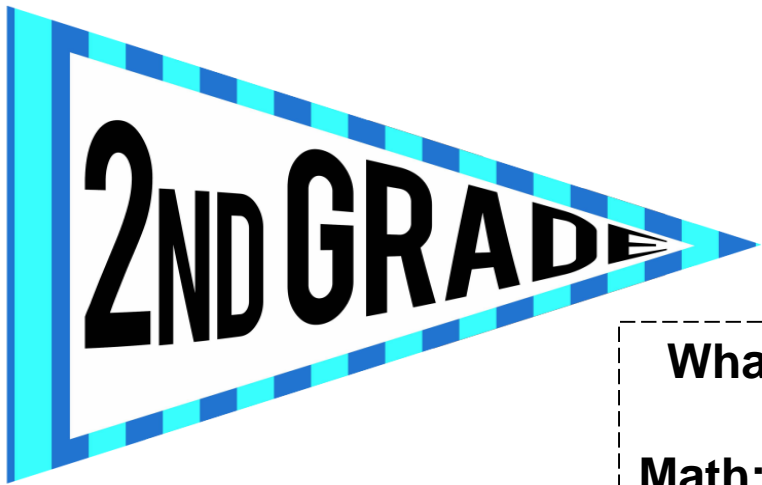
What are we learning?

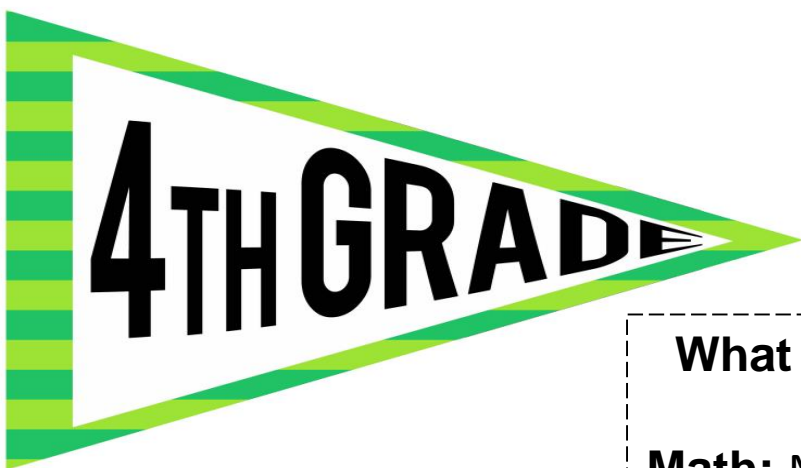

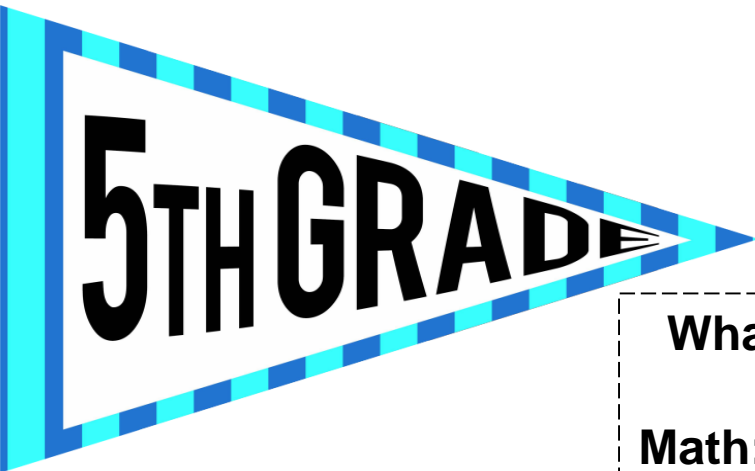
What are we learning?
