





Students will also only apply warm colors and cool colors to visually show the difference between day and night. 7th- Detailed eye drawing that must include the iris, pupil, lashes, tear duct, eye lid line, eye brow and shadowing to show contrast. Only one color can be applied to just the iris part of the eye to bring focal point to the students work.
