Welcome back, BPA Riverview families! As we begin our DREAM this year, and believe in it, all things become ACHIEVEABLE! Here are a few things you should know thus far:

Our theme this year is **Dream It**, **Believe It**, **Achieve It** and our teachers have a few dreams for the school year that they believe they can achieve!

Let's talk safety and procedures for a moment.

- We are in a new "normal" and in order to keep everyone safe, it must be understood that all students, staff, teachers, guests, and otherwise, must always wear a mask (except when eating).
- It is imperative that the mask fits snuggly yet be comfortable for the student to wear all day. It must cover the nose, mouth, and cleft of chin. We know it is difficult to find a child's sized mask, but if it cannot fit, try twisting the ear straps a little. It will help make a solid seal around their face.
- 3. Everyone must follow social distancing guidelines; in our case, we will ensure student groupings are kept to a minimum, markers on the floor serve to help with traffic flow. There is hand sanitizer in every room, teachers are demonstrating proper hand-washing to their students, and breakfast and lunch are now individually packaged and served in class.
- As well as these in-building procedures, dismissal takes place systematically. Please ensure you have your child's car tag or an ID before picking them up.
- Dress Code: BRIDGEPREP has a school uniform policy. It is very important your child comes to school wearing their complete uniform. You can purchase them from these links:



It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988, on the approval of Public Law 100-402.


