A Note from Administration

Covid-19 and the pandemic.

No matter what your belief or political stance is, Covid-19 is our new reality.

BPA is doing everything we can to help keep our school safe for our students, faculty, and staff. We need your help, parents, to ensure these safety measures are kept in place.

1. It seems almost silly to say this, but hand washing still takes precedence in helping to slow the spread; of any germ. Teach your students to sing the "Happy Birthday" song twice. Teach them to be vigilant in getting dirt from around and under their nails. Every time they go to the bathroom, before/after eating, sneezing, etc.

2. Take your vitamins (doctor approved, of course). Get enough sleep, especially the younger ones. Turn screens off at a certain time every night. Turn gaming systems off at a certain time every night. Give their little brains a chance to wind down. Make sure they are getting 8 or more hours sleep in. The CDC website has many ways one can stay healthy.

3. Keep your distance. Even in non-pandemic times, no one wants someone following them closely around a store while they shop. Observe the personal space rule and keep at least 6ft away. Touch only when you must touch something, use hand sanitizer if you cannot wash your hands right away, and observe the 6 foot rule as best you can.

4. Wear your mask! And most importantly, wear it correctly. It must cover your nose, mouth, and chin. Ideally, a KN95 mask is best. This is the important part: students must keep their masks on all day and keep their nose covered. Many students are coming into school with adult sized masks, masks covered in glitter (and the glitter is getting everywhere), or gaiters (the neck "masks"). These things are preventing proper protection from taking place.

The mask should fit snugly enough on their face so that no gaps occur but that it is also comfortable for them. Neck gaiters should have ear loops to hold the gaiter in place. Masks are only meant to be worn once a day, so they need to be washed every night OR have a rotating stock. Alternately, places like WalMart do sell child size disposable medical masks.

5. Finally: *stay home with ANY symptoms and do remote learning.* They must still attend school, however, just remotely. Your child's teacher will provide that information for you. Please do not physically attend school if you, your child, or anyone in your family is experiencing any symptoms. Notify the school and your child's teacher and if possible, have your child do remote learning.
