### A Note from Administration

Welcome back, BPA Riverview families!

Our theme this year is *BPAR: We bring all minds to life!* 🐾

Welcome back to our families who are back with us for another year and welcome to those who are joining us for the very first time this school year. October is Hispanic Heritage Month, and we will have projects, assignments and activities for students throughout the month to celebrate.

We use our iStation and Achieve3000 platforms to boost our reading skills like fluency, vocabulary and comprehension. Achieve3000 is for our students in grades 3<sup>rd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>. Each student should be doing a minimum of two articles per week. The articles have been set to your child's Lexile level. Because of this, each student should be scoring at least a 75 on their respond (activity) questions.

All grade levels use iStation. iStation is also set based on your child's level. iStation creates activities for your child to do based on that level. Your child should be spending at least 30 minutes a week on iStation.

Things you can do at home with your children regarding Achieve:

-Remind your child to go back to the text before answering each question

-When writing their thought question, they should use evidence from the text

-Check to see if what your child wrote answers the question that was asked

-Did they stay on topic?

-They should always pay attention to conventions like spelling, punctuation, and capitalization

For iStation:

-Are they on task?

-Did they do at least 30 minutes?
